AS OF NOW WE HAVE NOT BEEN MADE AWARE OF CHANGES TO STATE OR FEDERAL FUNDING WE HAD PLANNED NOR BUDGET BUT SOMETHING AS THE STATE MANAGES THEIR BUDGET PROCESSES IN THE NEXT COUPLE MONTHS AND THE FEDS CONTINUE TO TALK ABOUT A STIMULUS AND THINGS THEY NEED TO BE ABLE TO DO, WE'RE GOING TO KEEP A WATCHFUL EYE AND SEE WHAT KIND OF RESOURCES MAY COME BACK TO THE CITY.

MOVING ON TO THE CAPITAL PLAN OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW. IT'S DIFFERENT THAN CITY OPERATING BUDGET AND COVERS MAJOR CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS AND RENOVATION AND MAINTENANCE PROGRAMS OVER THE CITY. IT STRETCHES OVER A PERIOD TO ALLOW THE CITY TO DESIGN, BUILD COMPLEX PROGRAMS. THE CAPITAL PLAN IS THE CITY'S ROAD MAP TO MAINTAIN ROADS. BRIDGES, SCHOOLS AND PARKS AND USES A COMBINATION OF GEOBONDS AND GRARNTS -- GRANTS TO FUND THEM AND IT'S THROUGH DEBT SERVICE APPROPRIATED EVERY YEAR. THE CAPITAL PLAN CONSISTENT WITH THE IB30 PLAN AND UMBRELLA PLANS THAT FULL UNDERNEATH IT LIKE GO BOSTON 2030 AND MANY MORE. FOR THIS YEAR'S PLAN THE FY20-21 IS CONSISTENT WITH IB2030 AND THE REMAINING 10% GOES TO CORE

INFRASTRUCTURE AND THOUGH NOT DIRECTLY MENTIONED ARE THINGS I HAVE TO DO THROUGHOUT THE CITY. SINCE FY14 IT'S GROWN BY ABOUT 70%

THIS HAS COME THROUGH NEWttÑ INVESTMENTS IN SCHOOLS, NEW LIBRARIES, PARKS, NEW TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE THROUGHOUT THE CITY.

THE CITY HAS ALSO INCREASED THE AUTHORITIES AND OTHER RESOURCES LIKE CHAPTER 90 AND FEDERAL GRANTS.

THAT'S SOMETHING WE PRIORITIZE NOT ONLY INCREASING THE CITY INVESTMENT AND MAKING SURE WE'RE ACCESSING AS MUCH STATE AND FEDERAL DOLLARS AS WE CAN SOMETHING NOT REALLY DONE CONSISTENTLY OVER THE PAST 25 YEARS.

AS YOU KNOW, THE CITY HAS
UNDERTAKEN A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT
OF PLANNING EFFORTS AND THE
CAPITAL PLAN IS STARTING TO SEE
THE IMPACT OF THE NEW PROJECTS
AS THEY MOVE INTO ZIEVEN AND
CONSTRUCTION.

FOR -- DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION AND THE CAPITAL PLAN IS REFLECTING THE PROJECTS AND MECHE THE \$30 BILLION THRESHOLD FOR THE FIRST TIME AND YOU'LL SEE THE BREAK DOWN BY IMAGINE BOSTON 2030 CATEGORY. THE CITY SPENDS ABOUT 33% ON ROADS AND 24% ON SCHOOLS AND 10%

ON PUBLIC SAFETY AND 12% ON PARKS AND VARIOUS OTHER DEPARTMENTS MAKE UP THE REST. FOR FY21-25 THE PLAN PROPOSES TO ADD NEW GENERAL OBLIGATION BORROWING OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS.

OF THE NEW FUNDING WE'RE PROPOSING TO ADD \$139 MILLION FOR SCHOOLS, 26%, \$144 MILLION OR 27% FOR STREETS AND \$79 MILLION OR ABOUT 14% FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND \$55 MILLION OR ABOUT 10% TO HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

\$57 MILLION OR 11% TO PARKS, ENVIRONMENT AND OPEN SPACE AND \$48 MILLION OR 9% TOWARDS CITY SPACE.

WHEN BUILDING THE CAPITAL PLAN THE CITY HAS A STATUTORY CAP ON DEBT SERVICE AS A PERCENT OF THE CITY BUDGET.

THE PLANS BORROWING OVER THAT TIME OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS INCREASES THE DEBT LEVEL CLOSER TO THE 7% THRESHOLD.

WE BENEFIT FROM A TRIPLE A BOND RATING AND WE ARE STILL ABLE TO LIVE WITHIN THE 7%.

SO NOW MOVING ON TO SOME OF THE MAJOR NEW FY21 CAPITAL INVESTMENTS.

THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE EVERYTHING IN THE PLAN BUT HIGHLIGHTS SOME OF THE MAJOR NEW PROJECTS OR FUNDING CHANGES.

THE COLLEAGUES IN DFD WILL GET INTO MORE DETAILS IN THE MAJOR PROJECT AS THEY MANAGE.

THE MAJOR NEW FUNDING FOR THIS

WE ALSO HAVE HAD SOME ASSISTANCE WITH THE EMERGENCY WORK. ROBERT MELVIN AND ROBERT MILLER HAVE BEEN WORKING AND A WHOLE HOST OF THE PROJECT MANAGEMENT TEAMS AND CLERKS HAVE BEEN WORKING TO DO THINGS. WHEN IT GOES OVER \$100,000 IT GOES TO THE PUBLIC FACILITIES DEPARTMENT.

IT'S CREATED THROUGH AN ACT OF THE LEGISLATURE AND REQUIRES ALL MAJOR CONSTRUCTION WORK THAT REQUIRES MULTIPLE TRADES AND A VALUE IN EXCESS OF \$100,000, THAT WORK THEN FALLS UNDER THE CONTROL, CUSTODY AND OVERSIGHT OF THE PUBLIC FACILITIES DEPARTMENT.

I'LL JUST SAY TO JUSTIN IT CERTAINLY SEEMS TO ME WE DO NOT WANT STRAINS IN A SEASON OF ROBUST CAPITAL BUDGET IN A RECESSIONARY MOMENT TO BE A SHORTAGE OF STAFF [INDISCERNIBLE] IT DOES SEEM TO ME AS A COUNCILOR IT'S IMPORTANT LIKE ASSESSING AND REASSESSING IN REAL TIME WHAT IT'S GOING TO TAKE TO SHORTEN THE AMOUNT OF LOCK TIME FOR OUR CITY PROJECTS. THE ONE QUESTION I'LL JUST ASK JITSZ BEFORE BECAUSE I WANT TO GET TO MY COLLEAGUE IS JUST IF YOU COULD SPEAK A LITTLE BIT. JUSTIN, I ASKED SOME QUESTIONS ABOUT KIND OF THE POINT WE ACTUALLY ENGAGED THE DEBT. HOW MUCH IS OUR CAPITAL BUDGET THAT THIS BODY APPROVED WHAT WE'VE ACTUALLY GOTTEN OUT THE DOOR THE LAST FIVE YEARS AND WHAT ARE THE LEVERS THAT WE CAN MAKE IT THE MAXIMUM LIKE WE'RE ACTUALLY DOING THE CAPITAL WORK BUT ONLY OBVIOUSLY IN TANDEM WITH GETTING IT TO WORK IN A WAY THAT PUSHES RIGHT UP TO THAT [INDISCERNIBLE] >> SURE. I'LL TRY TO ANSWER IN TWO WAYS. AS FAR AS TRACKING VERSUS WHAT WE SPENT THE CITY COMING OUT OF THE RECESSION SPENT ABOUT 100, 125,000 A YEAR WE CAN RAMP THAT UP OVER 200 OVER THE NEXT YEAR. SOMETIMES WE SPENT 240 OR 190. THE TRAFFIC IS DICTATED BY HOW THE PROJECTS ARE MORE LIKELY TO GO SIDEWAYS THAN ANYTHING ELSE. THE BEST EXAMPLE I CAN GIVE IS THE LONG ISLAND BRIDGE WE EXPECT TO BE IN CONSTRUCTION AND BUILDING THAT BRINK RIGHT NOW WHICH IS A HUNDRED MILLION

ONE OF THE MORE, YOU KNOW, SCHEDULE ADD HERITANCE AND FORWARD THINKING DEPARTMENTS, TRYING TO LIKE SORT OF MAP THESE THINGS OUT NOT JUST IN THE SIX DOLLAR BRIDGE THAT WOULD DRASTICALLY IMPACT THE AMOUNT OF CASH WE HAVE ON HAND. WHEN IT COMES TO BORROWING, WE BORROW ONCE A YEAR, WE GO TO MARKET AND ISSUE ONE BOND A YEAR.

WE'RE REQUIRED BY THE BOND STATUTE TO EXTEND THAT THREE YEARS.

WE NEVER BORROW IN ADVANCE OF A PROJECT ACTUALLY GOING INTO THE GROUND.

WE CAN BORROW PROJECTS OVER MULTIPLE ISSUANCES SO BASICALLY BORROW FOR THE DESIGN PORTION AND BY THE TIME WE GET TO THE NEXT YEAR HALF OF THE CONSTRUCTION WE BORROW FOR THAT AND THE NEXT YEAR WE BORROW FOR THE LAST PIECE OF IT.

WHEN WE GO INTO THE MARKET WE STRUCTURE OUR PURCHASE OR OUR BOND TO MAKE SURE WE'RE STAYING COMPLETELY IN LINE WITH THE BOND [INDISCERNIBLE] GOING FORWARD. I THINK WHAT WE CAN DO TO SPEED THIS UP IS COMING OUT OF THIS THERE'S A LOT OF DIFFERENT WAYS THINGS CAN COME UP IN THE PROCESS WHETHER IT'S IN THE DESIGN PHASE, WHERE IT'S REAL ESTATE PHASE, WHETHER IT'S PROCUREMENT PHASE OR CONSTRUCTION PHASE.

WE NEED TO FOCUS GOING INTO NEXT YEAR DELIVERING ON THE CAPITAL PROJECT WHICH IS WHAT WE'RE FOCUSING ON BECAUSE WE'RE GOING TO BE PAST THAT DEVELOPING PLANS FOR EACH OF THESE DIFFERENT PROJECTS TO GET BACK UP. I THINK THAT'S SOMETHING WE'LL SEE REPEATED IN THE PARKS DEPARTMENT, TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND ALL THE OTHER CAPITAL DEPARTMENTS WHO ARE NOT [INDISCERNIBLE] MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE STAYING UP TO SPEED. THAT IS A CONCERN, RIGHT. WE DO A LOT OF CONSTRUCTION DURING THE SUMMER FOR SCHOOLS WE

DO A LOT OF ROAD CONSTRUCTION IN

THE SUMMER.
PARKS ARE MO

PARKS ARE MORE YEAR ROUND.

COMING OUT OF THIS WE'RE GOING

TO GET RENEWED PLAN FROM EVERY

SINGLE CONTRACTOR WE HAVE TO

MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE

FOLLOWING THE GUIDELINES AND I

WILL [INDISCERNIBLE] PARKS

DEPARTMENT MOVE IN THE PUBLIC

WORKS DEPARTMENT TO MAKE SURE

ALL THESE THINGS START TO HAVE AN CUMULATIVE EFFECT AND AFFECTS

THE DESIGN CONTRACTS.

THE DESIGNERS ARE GOING TO BE ON THE HOOK.

THEY'VE GOING TO BE LOOKING TO REVIEW PLANS AND EXPEDITE THINGS.

THOSE ARE GOING TO BE QUANTIFIED BUT FOR EACH PARTY.

I CAN'T SAY IT'S GOING TO BE A 10% UPGRADE BUZZ IT COULD BE 20% ON ONE AND 10 PERCENT POSTER ON ANOTHER.

WE'RE LOOKING CLOSELY AT THE BUDGET DEPARTMENT AND OUR OWN EXPERTISE AND STAFF AND WILL BE FARMING OUT THESE ADDITIONAL COSTS OR THESE CHANGE ORDER PROPOSALS.

THE QUESTIONS ANO DATE IN A FEW CAGHTS WHERE SOME THINGS GO TO STREETS AND PARKS AND B.P.S. AND I CERTAINLY ASKED A HUGE NUMBER OF QUESTIONS ABOUT THE STREETS AND PARKS ISSUES IN DISTRICT 8 THAT I AM EXPECTING TO HAVE DISCUSSED IN THAT HEARING OR INFORMATION IN ADVANCE. WITH THOSE SPECIFIC PROCEDURE, WE ARE FORWARDING THOSE TO THE DEPARTMENTS.

I WILL GO ON TO COUNCILLOR MATT O'MALLEY TO BE FOLLOWED BY COUNCILLOR MEJIA AND COUNCILLOR BREADON.

>> THANK YOU CHAIR, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, CHIEF FOR THE VERY EXPANSIVE AND LOCUACIOUS PRESENTATION.

I LOOK FOR THE BUDGET PROCESS. FOR THE NEWER COLLEAGUES, THIS IS REALLY EXCITING HEARING BECAUSE YOU GET TO SEE THOSE PROJECTS WE ADVOCATE FOR AND CARE ABOUT.

I REMEMBER EARLY DAYS OF TRYING TO ADVOCATE ON BEHALF OF MONEY AND PARK PHASE TWO, JAMAICA PLAIN AND THE PROJECTS THAT WERE COMPLETED OVER THE LAST YEARS SO THANK YOU FOR YOUR PARTNERSHIP THROUGH MAYOR WALSH AND HIS TEAM.

OBVIOUSLY, I DON'T NEED TO BE REPETITIVE, BUT MANY OF US HAVE SAID THIS IS A VERY UNUSUAL CAPITAL BUDGET HEARING AS WE HAVE A VERY AGGRESSIVE APPROACH. WE RECOGNIZE THE ENORMITY OF WHAT E.R. UP AGAINST. NUMBERS SHOW UP TO 20% OR CLOSE TO 20% OF MASSACHUSETTS RESIDENTS FILED FOR UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS.

WE ARE UP AGAINST AN ECONOMIC DOWNTURN UNLIKE ANYTHING WE'VE EVER SEEN AND OBVIOUSLY THAT WILL BE DIRECTLY IMPACTFUL TO OUR WORK.

HOWEVER, WE'RE AT A PLACE NOW
WHERE WE HAD A VERY STRONG
FISCAL YEAR LAST YEAR AND
OBVIOUSLY PROBABLY THE STRONGEST

DEVELOPMENT YEAR IN BOSTON'S HISTORY, SO IT'S EXCITING TO SEE WHAT THOSE ADVANCEMENTS WILL BE. I THINK YOU COULD MAKE THE CASE ON THE IMPORTANCE OF INVESTING NOT ONLY IN IMPORTANT ISSUES LIKE THE LONG ISLAND CAMPUS WHICH I'M GLAD TO SEE WORK PROCEED THERE. OBVIOUSLY WORK IN OUR SCHOOLS, SOMETHING THAT'S IMPORTANT. BUT ALSO PARKS AND SPACE. WE'LL GET INTO THAT IN A HIGHER LEVEL OF SPELLS PHISTY AT THE RELEVANT HEARING. BUT SUFFICE IT TO SAY, CHIEF, I KNOW I'VE TALKED WITH YOU, THE MAYOR, OTHERS, WE'RE DELIGHTED, TALKED WITH CHIEF COOK, OBVIOUSLY, DELIGHTED TO SEE BUILDING OF WESTFIELD IN WEST ROXBURY AS IT RELATES TO UPGRADES AND OTHER THINGS.

WE NEED A FULL RENOVATION THERE. WE RECOGNIZE THE CHALLENGES, BUT GIVEN THE FACT PEOPLE ARE OBVIOUSLY CLAMOR MORGUE MORE OUTDOOR SPACE, GIVEN THE FACT MOST OUTER NEIGHBORHOODS HAVE SEEN A DECREASE OF SCHOOL AGE IN POPULATION, THERE'S BEEN A 16% INCREASE IN WEST ROXBURY. ANYTHING WE CAN DO TO UPLIFT THE NEED FOR FULL RENOVATION OF BUILDINGS.

YOU KNOW THIS IS MY TOP PRIORITY IN WEST ROXBURY THIS BUDGET SEASON.

WANT TO GEAT GET THE FEEDBACK ON THAT.

SIMILARLY, EXCITED ABOUT WHAT'S IN STORE FOR THE COURT STREET AS WELL AS THE PLAZA, NEED TO SEE THOSE THINGS.

I DON'T NEED TO REHASH THAT, YOU NEED A GREAT OVERVIEW ON THAT STUFF.

I NEED TO CLOSE WITH THE JAMAICA PLAIN FAIR STATION, I KNOW THERE'S BEEN MONEY ALLOCATED FOR THAT AND THERE'S BEEN A DELAY SO YOU KNOW WHAT THE TIMELINE IS SPOAFNL THAT AND WHAT AND AND OBVIOUSLY RECOGNIZING THE FACT

THAT THAT CAN BE ADJUSTED GIVEN WHAT WE'RE UP AGAINST.

SO THANK YOU ALL.

>> COUNCILLOR, THANK YOU VERY MUCH, AND, YOU KNOW, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR PUSHING US CONSTANTLY.

YOU'VE BROUGHT UP THE FIRE DEPARTMENT.

I'M GOING TO DEFER THE BILLINGS CONVERSATION BECAUSE THAT'S OBVIOUSLY COMMISSIONER RYAN WOODS' CONVERSATION AND I WILL FORWARD YOUR CONCERNS TO THEM.

THOSE THINGS WOULD BE LIKE A

COMMUNITY MEETING.

IF THEY DO A MEETING ON DESIGN.

WE DON'T HAVE A CONTRACTOR THAT

WE CAN SEND THE MONEY BACK TO,

AND WE DON'T HAVE A SPECIFIC

CHARGEBACK. SO THOSE NIGHT MEETINGS OR THOSE EMERGENCY CALLOUTS WHERE WE MAY NEED SOMEONE, THAT'S WHERE THAT OVERTIME AND THAT PLACE HOLDER, I WOULD SAY IT'S A MICROCOSM OF THE OVERALL BUDGET, BUT IT IS THERE JUST IN CASE FOLKS NEED TO GO ABOVE AND BEYOND. WE DO HAVE A LOT OF PEOPLE THAT ARE STANDARD \$35 WORK WEEK PEOPLE THAT PUT IN 45 HOURS AND DON'T PUT IN A PENNY FOR OVERTIME, BUT WHEN WE ASK SOMEONE TO GO OUT AND DO THREE HOURS AT L STREET OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT, I'M NOT GETTING PAID, I'M SALARIED, BUT THE PEOPLE OUT THERE ARE AND WE WANT TO BE FAIR AND IN ADHERENCE WITH THE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT. SO THAT'S WHAT THAT \$100,000 IS THERE FOR. IT'S NOT MEANT TO COVER OVERTIME FOR A JOB THAT NEEDS TO EXPEDITE OR WORK NIGHTS OR WEEKENDS. THAT'S NOT THERE. THAT'S A COST THAT WOULD BE BORNE THROUGH THE CAPITAL SITE AND SOMETHING THAT WE WOULD CODIFY THROUGH A CHANGE ORDER. SO THAT'S THERE. THE BRJP, ALL OF OUR PROJECT MANAGERS KNOW, AND I THINK THERE'S A FEW PEOPLE ON THIS BODY THAT WOULD AGREE WITH ME, I WHOLEHEARTEDLY BELIEVE IN IT. THESE ARE BOSTON JOBS, BOSTON TAXPAYERS THAT PAY IT. BOSTON PEOPLE SHOULD BE BENEFITING FROM THAT WORK, AND FROM THE TOP DOWN, THAT'S FROM THE MAYOR-DOWN, SO WE'RE TRYING TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERY JOB MEETING THAT WE START STARTS WITH WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO ACHIEVE THE GOALS OF THE BOSTON RESIDENTS JOB POLICY, HOW DO WE DO IT? THERE'S (AUDIO DIFFICULTY) -- QUESTIONS ABOUT SORT OF THE SCOPE FOR THAT RFP WHICH I THINK IS UNDER BFD'S JURISDICTION BECAUSE I THINK THERE'S A STRONG DESIRE, THERE'S APP LOT OF INTEREST FOR THAT BEING IN THE HOUSING PUBLIC ASSETS. THERE'S A BUNCH OF FRIENDS GROUP OF INTEREST IN HOW YOU PROGRAM THE OUTDOOR SPACE IN FRONT OF THE LIBRARY ALONG WITH THE LIBRARY FACILITY SPACE. THERE'S -- THE COMMUNITY CENTER, IT'S ONE OF THE MOST USED BRANCH LIBRARIES IN THE WHOLE SYSTEM AND DOES A LOT OF INFORMAL COMMUNITY CENTER WORK NOW. IT TIES THE WEST END-NORTH END POOD PANTRY WHICH HAS BEEN CLOSED AND WE'RE SEEING THE LACK OF IN OUR DISTRICT, CLOSED BECAUSE OF THE PANDEMIC, BUT THE LIBRARIES WERE NOT BUILT IN SUPPORT OF THE FOOD PANTRY. I THINK BECAUSE TO HAVE THE TIME LINE AND THE -- AS WE WORK ON THE RENEW BOSTON --(TECHNICAL DIFFICULTY) -- FROM THE EARLY GENERATION THAT THE BHA WAS PART OF. I THINK IT'S SUCH A SMART IDEA TO DO OUR RETROFITTING WITH, YOU KNOW, THE FUTURE FINANCIAL BENEFITS OF ENERGY SAVINGS, BUT IF YOU DON'T STRUCTURE THEM CORRECTLY YOU CAN END UP IN WEIRD PLACES WHEN THE ENERGY MARKETS MOVE AND UNEXPECTED IN LONG-TERM WAYS. I HOPE IT'S SOMETHING P.F.D. IS THINKING ABOUT, IT SIGNS THOSE CONTRACTS AND -- YEAH, BUT MAINLY WANT TO ASK ABOUT THE WESTON LIBRARY. >> -- THE WEST END LIBRARY. PESPECIFIC AND WE WORK CLOSELY

WITH THE ENVIRONMENT WHO IS TAKING A LOOK IN TRACKING THE UTILITY COSTS, AND WE ARE OBVIOUSLY WEIGHING HEAVILY ON THE CFOs ANALYSIS OF SIGNING THOSE THINGS.

WE BUILD IT.

THEY TELL US WHETHER OR NOT IT WORKS WITH THE MAP AND WE HAVE FULL FAITH AND CONFIDENCE IN OUR BUDGET.

WEST END BRANCH LIBRARY IS ABOUT A \$200,000 STUDY.

IT'S GOING TO BE THE DEVELOPMENT OF TWO LIBRARY STUDIES INCLUDES MIXED USE AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

WE'LL LOOK AT THE DEVELOPMENT OF LIBRARY SERVICES AND THE OPERATION REQUIREMENTS SPACE PROGRAM, SUSTAINABLE BUILDING SYSTEMS, FIT TEST, AND INCLUDING MIXED USE.

AGAIN, THAT WOULD HELP SERVICE THE LOCAL BUSINESSES DURING THE WORKING HOURS, ET CETERA. WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE THINKING OF THOSE THINGS, MORE GEARED

TOWARD CHIEF BROPHY AND JUSTIN. FRANK HAD A GREAT PROPOSAL A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO AND OUR HOPE IS WE'LL START TO SEE SOME OF
