- What is the total cost of bus monitors?
- What are we doing to enhance the physical education curriculum, especially for students who may not be inclined towards team athletics?
  - What are we doing to expand the curriculum to include new and different programs?
- Can you provide a breakdown of all of BPS partnerships?

- What are we doing to ensure that food served at BPS is fresh and local? How can we utilize small and local businesses to provide food to our students?
- What opportunities are there currently to allow teacher, students and parents to provide feedback on their remote learning experiences?
- Can you provide information on summer classes?
  - o Are there opportunities for multi-lingual education this summer?
- What are we doing to improve opportunities to learn so-called "soft skills" or life skills in BPS?
- How are we using BPS partnerships to create opportunities for student employment?

### Councilor Annissa Essaibi-George asked:

- How many 21 year olds are in BPS that will turn 22 before the end of the school year or graduation?
  - How are we supporting students who are transitioning out of BPS at this age?

- Can we hire more athletic trainers, and have one available at every sports game?





- How can we benchmark ourselves against other large urban school districts in terms of the proportion of Central Office positions and salary to positions and salaries within our schools? Can you provide some context on this?
- Can you provide more information on what proportion of Central Office costs are actual Central Office costs, compared to those being centrally funded but delivered at a school site?
- How can we better involve teachers and school administrators when developing new curriculum programs, even if the funding lives in Central Office? What is the plan for teacher involvement in implementation of the new Ethnic Studies coursework, for example?
- Why was there a significant increase in family and medical leave this year? Was this related to COVID-19, or prior?
- What is being done to improve retention rates, especially for teachers of color?
- There seems to be a problem with the reliability of one-to-one bus monitors, which can really disrupt the lives of parents. What can be done to address this issue?
- How are we reorganizing our schools to address public health concerns?
- How is BPS thinking about its strategy moving forward on food and food procurement because it seems like we have this ongoing arrange with Revolution Foods, but we also started displacing that with My Way Café what's the long-term vision re: food quality and sourcing and access?
- How can we strategically utilize our food budgets to support small and local businesses through the economic recovery?
- What can be done to add more individualized athletic activities in way that is scalable and support schools that don't have great gym facilities?

- Can you provide more information on the transportation contract? We keep renewing the TransDev contract for single-year terms; when are we going to be in a position to issue a new RFP to adjust how we dictate the service that we want and pursue competitive pricing?
  - What is the overall long-term transportation plan and vision?
- Can you provide more information on summer school?
  - What can be done to expand summer school for all students, given that all students are being affected by COVID-19?
  - What are the costs for summer school this year more because of involving more students, or less because of all being virtual?
- What robust measures are being put in place to address student learning loss?
  - What is being done to support students that were already off-track before the pandemic? It feels like we need a moonshot now to really catch all our students up, or else COVID could set our efforts to close the achievement gap back five years – and the one silver lining would be to also sweep up the students who were already struggling with a surge of resources – thoughts?
- Can you provide information on the overall partnership strategy?
  - o How often are we paying our partners for services or programs?
  - What partners are putting resources into our schools and where?
  - How proactively do we match partners to concrete needs in our schools,
    vs. just accepting what a third-party offers to do?
  - O Development of partnerships is so often dictated by personal relationships; do we have a clear map or sense of where we have real strengths or holes in the partnership landscape, and how to even that out?
- If students are unable to return to classrooms in the fall, how will we be supporting the transition for teachers receiving new students in the fall?
  - o It seems very hard for teachers to build virtual relationships with students and families they've never met; has BPS been thinking about having teachers stay paired with their existing classes until we are back in person?
