**ORDER FOR A HEARING REGARDING THE  
IMPLEMENTATION OF POLICY REQUIRING ALL  
BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO HAVE A FULL-TIME  
MENTAL HEALTH AND SOCIAL EMOTIONAL SUPPORT  
SPECIALISTS**

- WHEREAS:** The Boston Public School district has 125 schools with approximately 56,000 students enrolled; and
- WHEREAS:** Boston Public Schools FY19 budget invested \$2.3 million so that there are now over 150 nurses throughout BPS, ensuring that every school has at least one full time nurse; and
- WHEREAS:** During the FY20 budget process, funding was secured to hire an additional 23 mental health providers/social emotional support specialists, but the hiring process was substantially delayed; and
- WHEREAS:** As of September 2019, BPS employed 75 school psychologists and 59 social workers and/or clinical coordinators; and
- WHEREAS:** It is our obligation to support the social, emotional, behavioral, mental, and physical well-being of all of our students by providing resources and support to address issues and concerns such as, but not limited to, depression, trauma, anxiety, and bullying; and
- WHEREAS:** Every school should have a full-time nurse and full-time mental health specialists;  
**THEREFORE BE IT**
- ORDERED:** That the appropriate committee of the Boston City Council hold a hearing to discuss the progress Boston Public Schools has made to ensure every school has a full-time nurse as well as the implementation needs and challenges to guarantee that every school also has full-time social emotional support specialists, including full-time psychologists and full-time social workers.
