

Community Engagement Summary

Egleston Square Redesign: Existing Conditions

The Egleston Square Redesign project is the next step in a series of planning efforts now heading into design. The goal of the project is to create a safer design for the Egleston Square intersection and to implement safety improvements on surrounding neighborhood streets for all road users. This flyer summarizes community engagement conducted so far to inform the existing conditions and needs assessment for the project.

Feedback Themes

- // The intersection of Columbus and Washington is the primary safety concern.
- // There is no comfortable and direct connection between Franklin Park and the Southwest Corridor Park for people biking.
- // Accessibility is an issue for seniors, people with disabilities, and people pushing carts or strollers.
- // Walgreens, the YMCA, The Dimock, the Library and other important destinations require better access by foot.
- // Speeding, signal timing, and sight distances create safety issues at many intersections.
- // Access to parking is a priority for many local business owners.
- // Youth often walk to and from neighborhood schools and the YMCA.

Socially Distanced Pop-Up Meetings were held to engage with the community in the project study area.


