The following meeting notes document the April 13, 2021 meeting held between Boston Parks, the Project Team and the North End Community.

# **Community Comments/Feedback**

## **Design Feedback:**

- Desire to reduce the park programmatic elements (play, adult exercise, water feature, dog area, etc), so that the remaining priority programmatic elements have a reasonable amount of space.
- Concerns that attracting dogs could lead to noise problems, but there was also support for the social aspects of dogs & their owners meeting at the park.
- Support for moving the court away from both Morton & Stillman Streets to open the edges of the park and make it more inviting.
- o Desire for gross motor play, open play, and natural play opportunities.
- Concern picnic tables may draw large numbers of people to the park. Picnic tables may also result in large volumes of trash.
- Support for saving all the trees. (understanding some trees may be removed, such a the female ginko)
- o Attendees generally preferred the ½ court option.
- o Attendees generally preferred a larger play area.
- o Attendees generally preferred a flexible seating area.

## Other Issues/Concerns:

- Existing lighting is adequate in terms of coverage but the poles/fixtures are dated and should be replaced.
- Desire for Boston Police Department security cameras, Boston Parks has already begun the conversations with BPD.
- Desire to retain & reveal any historic park elements that may still be present in the park.
- o The community would like to see Morton Street (outside the scope of this project) be improved as a pedestrian space compatible with the park. Boston Parks has

- elevated this comment to the Parks Commissioner and Boston Transportation Department.
- o Desire to add a drinking fountain.
- Concerns raised about trash on Morton street and the associated odor and rodent problems.
- Discussion that park maintenance will be important after the proposed improvements.
