

#### Section II – Architectural Plans

The proposed roof deck is set back 3' from the roof line in the front and front-side. The headhouse already exists and is minimally visible.

The left-hand elevation is from the rear of the building and is not visible from a public way. The middle elevation is the view from lower Temple Street. The right-hand elevation is from the front of the building and is the view from Derne Street.

#### Section III – Materials






Section IV – Visibility from Public Ways

Photos were taken from 7 locations on Temple and Derne Streets. The locations of the first 6 pairs of photos are shown on the map below. The location of the 7<sup>th</sup> pair of photos is the bottom of Temple Street at Cambridge Street, and is not shown on the map. Areas on the map where the proposed deck railing would be visible are highlighted. There is additional visibility not shown on the map from further down Temple Street, as indicated by photo 7. There is no visibility from other public ways.


The ribbons on the mock-up are 4.5' high. The support poles are approximately 5' high.
