Proposed Accessible Garage Elevator Entry

01 NEED

The existing 235 Huntington Ave building does not have an elevator. The proposed elevator will serve the public and some BYSO students at the south end of the Plaza parking garage. As a BYSO serving elevator and public serving elevator, a public plaza level entrance is required to be outside of the BYSO interior spaces. The proposed elevator vestibule and elevator door opening occupies the currently exterior arched passage at the north east corner of the building.








235 Huntington Avenue - East and West (top) Facing

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


The proposed elevator vestibule and elevator door opening occupies the currently exterior arched passage at the north east corner of the building. This location serves all public patrons at the south end of the garage who often use the garage during Boston Symphony Orchestra performances.



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03 Proposed Infill Area


An opening in the concrete wall will allow for the elevator door to open into the space. The walking finishes will maintain the field of the Plaza brick paving into the vestibule. As a public accessible space the interior of the arched passageway has been maintained.



Proposed Plan Detail

Proposed Infill Area

Use of low iron glass will keep the transparency of the archway, maintaining viewsheds of the trees and the Church through the archway.






Proposed Infill Elevations

Minimalist Approach

The glazed entrance walls on either side of the vestibule are set back from the arched concrete opening to maintain the exterior prominence of the archway. Use of low iron glass will keep the transparency of the archway, maintaining view-sheds of the trees and the Church through the archway.

Maintain Views of Trees Beyond, and the Church from Huntington Ave.

As a public accessible space the interior of the arched passageway has been maintained. Previous modifications of the Reflecting Pool have allowed for pedestrian access to flow around the archway.

Minimalist Approach
