AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND FY23 Safe and Successful Youth Initiative FUNDS, AWARDED BY MA Executive Office of Health and Human Services.

WHEREAS, the MA Executive Office of Health and Human Services, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of THREE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (**\$3,450,000.00**) would fund a comprehensive, inter-agency strategy that connects law enforcement, employment, education, public health and youth development agencies to reduce youth violence in the Commonwealth. Therefore be it

ORDERED: that the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston be, and hereby is authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the MA Executive Office of Health and Human Services, FY23 Safe and Successful Youth Initiative award not to exceed the amount of THREE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (**\$3,450,000.00**).
