Bid Requirements:

1. All Proposals shall be submitted to the awarding authority at Property Management, 205 River Street, Mattapan Campus, prior to the bid deadline (time & date above) at which time and place all bids will be publicly opened & read out loud.

2. All prevailing wage laws and Minimum wage laws will apply. The BPHC reserves the right to disqualify any or all bids based on either price or past performance.

3. Proposals cannot be faxed in.

4. Any person submitting a proposal for, or signing a contract to work on, a public building or public works project must certify under pains and penalties of perjury that he or she is able to furnish labor in harmony with all other elements of labor employed on the work and that all employees employed on the worksite, or in subject to the bid; And have successfully completed at least ten hours of OSHA approved training.

5. BPHC, Property Management is not responsible for UPS, or other delivery arrangements delays. Contractor is the sole responsible of submitting proposals to the Awarding Authority in time/ no exceptions.

6. All Proposals shall be valid for 45 days after submittal.

7. All Proposals must be clearly marked with the Project Title and Project number on the front of a seal envelope.

8. Contract Award is contingent upon the lowest bidder executing the Commissions Standard Form Contract.

9. This is a Request for Proposals. The Contract will be awarded after receipt of proposals to the most advantageous, responsible, and responsive applicant.

III. SCOPE OF WORK

The Boston Public Health Commission (BPHC) is seeking services for Maritime passenger transportation to and from Long Island. The proposed vessels should have a protective enclosure to safeguard passengers from weather conditions.

The BPHC is also seeking for operational services of barging transportation to and from Long Island. Barging services to start on April 1st, 2023, through March 31st, 2026.

1. TERM

April 1st, 2023, through March 31st, 2026.

The Boston Public Health Commission reserves the right to change any of the proposed date in this scope of work. The "Commission" will notify bidders if proposed dates are to be changed.

2. FREQUENCY OF PASSENGER FERRY

Company Shall guarantee a minimum of two roundtrips per week and up to 7 roundtrips per week (Weather Dependent)

Notwithstanding the anticipated schedule described herein is based on experience, the frequency of trips may be revised at any time to reflect operational changes as necessary.

3. PASSENGER AMOUNT

4-20 Passengers

4. TRAVEL AND DEPARTURE

BPHC prefers departures scheduled from 1 Victory Road, Squantum Point Park, Quincy, MA to Long Island Campus. Return trips originate from Long Island Campus back to 1 Victory Road, Squantum Point Park Quincy, MA

(General Schedule but may vary depending on needs of BPHC Staff) Departures: 8:00AM – From Squantum Point Park Returns: 2:30PM – Long Island Campus Company must be flexible with the time for unforeseen emergencies.

Squantum Point Park is a public dock owned by DCR. Vendors can utilize this dock for embarking and disembarking at no fee. To the best of BPHC understanding there is no anchoring or mooring allowed at this dock.

Company shall have an alternate location if for any circumstance DCR has to close or remove dock for repairs.

5. BARGE SERVICES FROM APRIL 1ST, 2023 THROUGH MARCH 31ST, 2026

a. Barge as needed for, but not limited to the following: Vehicles, equipment, snow removal equipment, trash containers, trash compactors (up to 30 yards), storage containers, oil truck deliveries, among others. Barge oil transportation capacity to be no less than 5,000 gallons per service (company shall have all credentials for transporting oil). Ideal barge to be able to transport more than one vehicle at a time.

The Commission has the discretion to increase or decrease the number of barge trips as necessary.

Scheduling of the barge is customarily conducted as a team effort among BPHC, barging company and other third parties such as oil delivery, waste management or other companies. Coordination among all parties is expected as necessary to complete or carry out successful deliveries.

- b. Barge lands at sandy beach area. Heavy vehicles and equipment occasionally get stuck. BPHC will give preference to a company that can transport a crane, tractor or similar equipment to assist with the pulling of stuck vehicles as needed.
- c. Barge size and capacity to accommodate a minimum of two vehicles or two large pieces of equipment. BPHC will give preference to a company that can barge several large items at a time.
- d. BPHC will also give preference to a company that can provide a barge that has the ability to break through ice located around the dock or gangway on Long Island.

6. ADD ALTERNATE- FLOATING DOCK & GANGWAY FROM April 1st, 2023, through March 31st, 2026

1. Floating dock – Vendor must be able to supply and install a floating dock. <u>Floating dock to be no less than of 40'L x 15'W x 6'D (minimum)</u>. Vendor must also provide preventative measures prior to adverse weather and remove / safeguard the equipment. BPHC is not liable for damages incurred to equipment due to adverse weather.

Existing floating dock is fastened to fixed piles. BPHC to provide photos showing the details of existing fastening method. BPHC to provide the depth of existing floating dock. See Photos attached.

 Gangway – Vendor must be able to install and supply gangway. Vendor must also provide preventative measures prior to adverse weather and remove / safeguard the equipment. BPHC is not liable for damages incurred to equipment due to adverse weather. Existing gangway is divided into two parts. Each section is 32' feet, Totaling 64 feet. The gangway width is 2'10". See photos attached.

7. STIPULATION FOR EMERGENCY RUNS & CANCELLATIONS

Starting on April 1st, 2023, through March 31st, 2026, BPHC may request short notice emergency runs.

BPHC will provide notifications 24 hours in advance for any additional transportation services required. Emergency needs will be defined as such and will require the prompt assistance of services.

BPHC has the right to cancel transportation at any time; furthermore, BPHC will provide such cancelation notices by no later than midnight of previous date. Vendor must notify BPHC of any cancellations due to adverse navigation conditions or weather-related cancellations as soon as possible.

BPHC understand transportations are contingent on weather conditions. BPHC will not be liable to compensate for weather related cancellation or any other cancellation reasons.
