



CONSTRUCTION WORKERS: KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

Beginning December 1, 2023, the City of Boston Safe Construction and Demolition Operations Ordinance will provide safety protections to workers on the job.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

If your employer has not provided these protections you can make a complaint to the Inspectional Services Department by calling 617-635-5300 or emailing isd@boston.gov.

1. Workers must receive a Site Safety Orientation on the Site Safety Plan in a language they understand. Workers must also attend pre-Shift Safety Meetings. Workers on construction projects larger than 50,000 square feet or demolition projects larger than 4 stories must have access to a Site Safety Coordinator at all times.

The Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) entitles all workers to a safe workplace. Employers must keep the workplace free of known health and safety hazards.
