Components of Program Implementation

- ❑ **Program Design:** What the students will experience
- ❑ **Student Enrollment/Assignment:** Which students are in need of this educational experience
- ❑ **Curriculum and instructional materials:** What are the resources needed to provide this experience (space, furniture, technology, etc)
- ❑ **Assessment and Accountability:** How will we know that the program is meeting the goals and who is responsible for adjusting for program outcomes.
- ❑ **Staff and Professional Learning:** Who will do the work and what they will need to be ready to do the work effectively
- ❑ **Family and Community Engagement:** Stakeholders who need to be involved and engaged in the process
- ❑ **Supplementary Resources:** Materials and partnerships that are used outside of the core program to enhance student experience.

MD Program Design

The MD Program takes into consideration the varied cognitive and physical needs students in order to provide them an educational and developmentally appropriate learning experience.

- **Student Assignment:** Students who are assigned to this program are in need of an educational experience that will take into account their severe cognitive limitations, limited spoken language and in some cases serious physical impairments
- **Program schedule entails:** functional academic lessons, occupational and physical therapy, life skills development to establish independent living skills, vocational training opportunities for older students

Physical Impairment - The physical capacity to move, coordinate actions, or perform physical activities is exhibited by difficulties in one or more of the following areas: physical and motor tasks; independent movement; performing basic life functions. The term include severe orthopedic impairments or impairments caused by congenital anomaly, cerebral palsy, amputations, and fractures, if such impairment adversely affects a student's educational performance.
