ORDERED: That the sum of One Million Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,025,000) be, and the same hereby is appropriated, from the income of the Edward Ingersoll Browne Fund, pursuant to a vote of the Edward Ingersoll Browne Fund Commission and further that the said sum be expended as follows:

To Boston Police District 14 and Brighton Marine Health Center – for the landscape design of an outdoor space into a neighborhood passive park including the restoration of the Lt. Boyden Memorial	\$40,000
To the Fund for Boston Neighborhoods – for the fabrication and installation of a memorial honoring the victims of the 2013 Boston Marathon bombings	\$350,000
To the Codman Square Neighborhood Council – for the design of landscape improvements and artistic pieces for Codman Square Park	\$35,000
To Massachusetts College of Art and Design – for the renovation of the public space surrounding the Bakalar and Paine Galleries at the Massachusetts College of Art and Design.....	\$100,000
To the Veterans and Friend of Gourdin Memorial Park – for the creation of a memorial to celebrate and honor the contributions of African-American veterans and the achievements of Justice Edward O. Gourdin.....	\$250,000
To the Boston Chapter of Advancing Women in Transportation – for the creation of public art to celebrate the contributions of diversity and creativity that women bring to the transportation industry in Boston	\$100,000

To the Ringer Park Public Art Tribute Committee –for the
fabrication and installation of public art to recognize community
members who have inspired and had a positive impact on the
Brighton community\$150,000
