GOOD MORNING, GOOD AFTERNOON.  
MY NAME IS MICHELLE WU.  
I AM CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE ON  
PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT AND  
TRANSPORTATION.  
AND WE ARE HERE FOR A HEARING ON  
SEVERAL GRANTS REQUESTS.  
AUTHORIZATIONS ON THREE SEPARATE  
DOCKETS.  
I WANT TO REMIND EVERYONE BEFORE  
WE START THIS PUBLIC HEARING IS  
BEING RECORDED AND BROADCAST  
LIVE ON CHANNELS COMCAST 8, OUR  
CN8 TWO AND VERIZON 1964 AS WELL  
AS STREAMING ON THE CITY OF  
BOSTON WEBSITE, IF YOU WOULD  
LIKE TO TESTIFY, PLEASE CHECK  
THE BOX AND WE WILL OPEN UP FOR  
TESTIMONY AT THE END.  
BEFORE I HAND IT OVER TO OUR  
PANEL, WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM  
VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS I WILL JUST  
READ THE ACTUAL TEXT OF THE  
DOCKET INTO THE RECORD. SO BEAR  
WITH ME.  
THIS HEARING IS ON DOCKET NUMBER  
1083, METHOD AND ORDER  
AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON  
TO ACCEPT AND EX-PA END THE  
AMOUNT OF \$100,000 IN THE FORM  
OF A GRANT FOR THE EFFICIENCY  
AND REGIONALIZATION GRANT  
AWARDED BY THE MASSACHUSETTS  
DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO THE, TO  
BE ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE OF  
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.  
THE GRANT WILL FUND THE "GREATER  
BOSTON" REGIONAL ECONOMIC  
COMPACT CITIES, TO HIRE A  
CONSULTANT WHO WILL DEVELOP AN  
ACTION PLAN OF OPERATIONAL  
PROJECTS BASED ON OVERLAPPING  
NEEDS EXPRESSED IN THE  
MUNICIPALITY MASTER PLANS.  
SECONDLY GO TO DOCKET 1236,  
MESSAGE AND ORDER AUTHORIZING  
THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT  
\$855,000 IN THE FORM OF A GRANT  
FOR THE FY 19 SUCCESS LINK  
EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM, A WARDED BY

THE MASSACHUSETTS EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF LABOR AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, PASSED THROUGH THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND OF BOSTON TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH ENGAGEMENT AND EMPLOYMENT. THE GRANT WILL FUND SUMMER JOBS FOR 469 YOUTH FROM JULY 9TH THROUGH AUGUST 17, 2018.

AND FINALLY DOCKET NUMBER 1239, MESSAGE AND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND THE AMOUNT OF \$33,500 IN THE FORM OF A GRANT FOR SURVEY AND PLANNING AWARDED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, PASSED THERE 2 COMMONWEALTH ARCHIVES, TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT. THE GRANT WILL FUND PHASE 3 OF THE ROXBURY SURVEY UPDATE AND THE NOMINATION FOR THE MALCOLM X COLLINS HEALTH IN ROXBURY TO THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES.

GREAT, SO FEEL FREE, WHOEVER WOULD LIKE TO START, IF YOU COULD INTRODUCE YOURSELF AND THEN IF YOU COULD GIVE A BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE GRANT AND WE WILL GO THROUGH GRANT BY GRANT WITH QUESTIONS.

DO YOU WANT TO BEGIN.

>> GOOD AFTERNOON, CHAIRWOMAN WU, MY NAME IS CHRISTA SALVATORE, I AM CHIEF OF STAFF IN THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR TAKING THE TIME TO DISCUSS DOCKET 1083.

THIS GRANT WILL FUND THE REGIONAL COMPACT CITIES TO HIRE A CONSULTANT WHICH HAS BEEN DETERMINED AS THE MASS DONAHUE INSTITUTE WHO WILL DEVELOP AN ACTION PLAN OF OPERATIONAL PROJECTS BASED ON OVERLAPPING NEEDS EXPRESSED IN THE MUNICIPALITY'S MASTER PLAN. UNDER THE 2016 MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, THE SIX COMPACT CITIES WHICH ARE BOSTON, BRAINTREE, CAMBRIDGE, CHELSEA,

QUINCY AND SUMMERVILLE HAVE  
AGREED TO FORM A PARTNERSHIP AS  
THE "GREATER BOSTON" ECONOMIC  
COMPACT .. UNDERSTANDING THAT  
THE SIGNATORIES CITIES WILL  
BENEFIT COLLECTIVELY AND  
INDIVIDUALLY FROM INCREASED CAB  
INVESTIGATION, THE COMPACT PLANS  
TO FOCUS ON HOUSING,  
TRANSPORTATION, SUSTAINABILITY  
AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, WE  
URGE YOU TO APPROVE THIS DOCKET  
.. SO WE CAN BEGIN USING THE  
FUNDS WHICH HAVE A ONE-YEAR  
EXPENDITURE REQUIREMENT.

>> THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU VERY MUCH, JUST TO  
CLARIFY, IS THIS JUST ONE PIECE  
OF THE FUNDING THAT THIS GROUP  
WILL HAVE OR IS IT -- IS THIS  
KIND OF THE ENTIRE SCOPE OF WHAT  
WILL BE AVAILABLE TO THE -- FOR  
THIS COMPACT?

>> THIS IS JUST THE GRANT, SO  
THERE HAVE BEEN -- THERE WAS  
ANOTHER EARLIER GRANT FOR  
OPERATIONS.

>> OKAY.

HOW MUCH WAS -- SO HOW MUCH  
TOTAL HAS --

>> THAT WAS A \$35,000 GRANT FROM  
THE, ALSO FROM THE STATE, AND I  
WILL ALSO JUST -- I WILL  
DOUBLE-CHECK TO SEE IF THERE ARE  
OTHER SOURCES OF FUNDS.

>> OKAY.

SO THE YEAR THAT THIS GROUP HAS  
TO EXPEND THE \$100,000  
ESSENTIALLY IS ALREADY SETTLED,  
RIGHT?

BECAUSE THE CONSULTANT --  
INSTITUTE HAS BEEN RETAINED, AND  
NOW IT IS JUST ALLOWING THEM TO  
ACCESS THE FUNDS OVER THE NEXT  
YEAR TO MAKE THE LIST OF  
PROJECTS?

>> I WILL CONFIRM THE EXACT  
TIMELINE BUT THAT'S MY  
UNDERSTANDING.

THAT WILL BE FROM THE START OF  
THE CONTRACT.

>> OKAY.

AND WHAT TYPES OF PROJECTS IS  
BOSTON PUTTING FORWARD FOR

CONSIDERATION?

>> THE YOUNG WOULD MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THOSE, IN THE PAST, YOU KNOW, TWO YEARS, SINCE WE HAVE STARTED WORKING ON THIS COMPACT, SOME NATURAL COLLABORATIONS HAVE FORMED, WE HAVE PARTICIPATED WITH COMPACT CITIES AND PARTICIPATING WITH BIO AND OTHER ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS AND THIS WILL HELP US SOLIDIFY HOW WE GO FORWARD WITH THAT.

>> OKAY.

AND WHO WILL REMAIN THE CONTACT PERSON ON THE CITY'S SIDE FOR THIS?

>> ANDREW GRACE AND ALSO WITH ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

>> OKAY.

GREAT.

SO WE HAVE -- WE HAVE BEEN A PART OF THIS FOR TWO YEARS ALREADY.

IS THERE AN END DATE TO THE COMPACT, LIKE, FOR EXAMPLE, IS IT A FIVE-YEAR PARTNERSHIP OR IS IT KIND OF JUST CONTINUING AS LONG AS THE CITIES WANT TO CONTINUE WORKING TOGETHER?

>> IT IS ONGOING.

OKAY.

>> ANYTHING -- ANYTHING ELSE UNUSUAL ABOUT THIS GRANT OR DIFFERENT CAN FROM PREVIOUS YEARS --

>> THIS IS THE FIRST ONE THAT WE WILL BE GETTING THAT IS LIKE THIS.

>> OKAY.

SO THE LAST TWO YEARS THAT THE COMPACT CITIES HAVE BEEN UP AND RUNNING, IT IS JUST -- THERE HASN'T BEEN FUNDING ATTACHED TO IT?

>> CORRECT.

YES WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON IT INTERNALLY WITH OUR PARTNER ORGANIZATION -- OR WITH OUR PARTNER CITIES SO IT HAS BEEN AT THE STAFF LEVEL.

>> GOT IT.

OKAY.

AND THIS IS LIKELY JUST A

ONE-TIME GRANT THEN OR WILL, OR  
IF THERE IS SUCCESS FROM  
IDENTIFYING A LIST OF PROJECTS  
IS THERE OPPORTUNITY FOR ANOTHER  
GRANT NEXT YEAR?

>> THAT IS GOOD QUESTION.

I WOULD HAVE TO CHECK ON THAT  
FOR YOU.

>> OKAY.

ALL RIGHT.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

HI.

>> GOOD AFTERNOON, CHAIRWOMAN

WU.

I AM -- I APOLOGIZE I AM A BIT  
HOARSE.

GO RED SOX.

>> DOCKET NUMBER 1236, WITH  
REGARD TO THE YOUTH WORKS  
FUNDING.

THE YOUTH WORKS, YOUTH PROGRAM  
PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE MASS  
COMMONWEALTH CORPORATION, AND IT  
IS DESIGNED TO PROVIDE  
LOW-INCOME TEENS AND NEW ADULTS  
14 TO 21 YEARS OF AGE WITH THEIR  
FIRST EMPLOYMENT EXPERIENCES,  
WORK READINESS TRAINING AND  
SKILLS DEFINED AND KEY  
SUBSIDIZED JOBS.

THE FUNDS ARE COMING THROUGH THE  
MAYOR'S OFFICE OF WORKFORCE  
DEVELOPMENT, THEY ADMINISTER A  
PORTION OF THE YOUTH WORKS  
GRANT, GRANT AND DISTRIBUTE THE  
FUNDING TO FOR, FOUR BOSTON  
SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT  
PROGRAMS, AS PROVIDERS, WHICH IS  
ACTION FOR BOSTON COMMUNITY  
DEVELOPMENT, BOSTON PRIVATE  
INDUSTRY COUNCIL AND DEPARTMENT  
OF YOUTH EMPLOYMENT ENGAGEMENT  
BY EE, AND YOUTH AUCTIONS,  
UNLIMITED.

YE EVIDENT ARE INTENDS TO USE  
THESE FUNDS IN THE SUMMER OF  
2019 THE WAY THEY DID IN 2018,  
WHICH IS TO PROVIDE ELIGIBLE  
YOUTH WITH EMPLOYMENT OVER THE  
SUMMER MONTHS, IN 2018, THEY HAD  
474 YOUTH THAT WERE SERVED IN  
THIS GRANT, THEY HIRED FIVE  
CAREER DEVELOPMENT COACHES TO  
IMPROVE WORK READINESS PROGRAM

FOR THE YOUTH PARTICIPANTS AND THE YOUTH RECEIVED 15 HOURS OF SIGNIFICANT SUCCESS CURRICULUM PROVIDED BY THE STAFF.

IN 2019 THEY INTEND TO -- THERE ARE, ASSIST 500 YOUTH, USING THIS GRANT.

SO YOU MENTIONED THE FOUR DIFFERENT PROVIDERS, INCLUDING THE CITY'S AGENCY SO THE 855,000 IS SPREAD ACROSS ALL FOUR?

>> MY UNDERSTANDING IS IT IS JUST FOR --

>> OKAY.

SO THE OTHER ORGANIZATIONS THEN SORT OF HAVE THEIR OUTSIDE FUND-RAISING AND WHEN -- AND EMPLOY YOUTH ON THEIR OWN IN THAT WAY OR EMPLOYEE YOUTH IN DIFFERENT POSITIONS?

>> I DON'T KNOW HOW.

I CAN FIND OUT.

>> OKAY.

JUST CURIOUS, BE UH THE 500 JOBS YOU ARE TALKING ABOUT IS JUST YEE?

>> IS JUST YEE.

>> YES.

IN THE SLOTS WE HAVE, 500, CLOSE TO 500 ARE SUPPORTED THERE NEW GRANT.

>> GOT IT.

OKAY.

AND HAS THIS AMOUNT -- SO WE ARE INTENDING TO SERVE MORE YOUTH WITH IT, SO THE AMOUNT HAS BEEN GOING UP COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEARS?

>> IT IS THE SAME APT AS LAST YEAR IS MY UNDERSTANDING.

>> SO HOW SIT POSSIBLE TO GO FROM 474 TO 500.

THERE ARE OPERATIONAL COSTS. THE FINAL TOTAL AMOUNT THAT WAS SPENT TO SUPPORT THOSE JOBS LAST YEAR WAS 800, ALMOST 829 -- 5,000 -- I WILL HAVE TO GET BACK TO YOU.

>> I -- I AM JUST CURIOUS HOW WE GOT TO THAT.

>> SOME OPERATIONAL COSTS SUPPORTED THROUGH YEE FUNDING.

>> OKAY.

AND THAT WILL BASICALLY -- YOU

ARE SAYING THERE WERE SOME THINGS THAT WERE PAID FOR LAST YEAR THAT NO LONGER NEED TO BE AND -- SO, THEREFORE, MORE OF THE FUND ASKING GO TO ACTUALLY SUBSIDIZING THE YOUTH?  
>> THAT IS CORRECT.  
>> BUT I CAN CLARIFY.  
>> JUST CURIOUS.  
AND THEN WHAT IS THE METRICS THAT ARE TAKEN BASED ON THE PARTICIPATION?  
FOR EXAMPLE, IS THERE ANY LOOK BACK TO UPS WHAT THE DEMOGRAPHICS WERE OF THE YOUTH THAT WERE PARTICIPATING OR HOW THEY FELT THAT THE PROGRAM WENT OR HOW MUCH THEY LIKED THIS POSITION VERSUS THAT ONE THAT THEY WERE PLACED AT?  
>> SO THE YOUTH, THEY TAKE A PRE AND POST-TEST, AND SO THEY SELF REPORT.  
>> OKAY.  
AND IS THAT INFORMATION AVAILABLE ANYWHERE OR DOES THE CITY -- IS IT LIKE A REPORT THAT IS AVAILABLE OR --  
>> I CAN CERTAINLY FIND OUT AND GET BACK TO YOU.  
>> OKAY.  
THAT WOULD BE GREAT.  
>> AND THIS IS -- IS IT SUPPLEMENT OR IS IT SORT OF OVERLAPPING WITH, FOR EXAMPLE, WHEN THE FOUNDATION, FUND RAISES FOR THE SUPER TEENS PROGRAM, IS THAT PART OF THIS OR IS THAT --  
>> NO.  
IT IS SEPARATE.  
>> OKAY.  
SO IN IS FROM THE STATE, AND THIS DOESN'T INCLUDE --  
>> 13 AND 14-YEAR-OLDS.  
>> 13 AND 14?  
>> YES.  
SO FOR EXAMPLE, THE MAYOR DOES THIS BIG --  
>> HOBNOB.  
>> HOBNOB FUND RAISER THAT IS TO ADD MORE TO THIS POT AS WELL FOR THE IS CITY AGENCY TO BE ABLE TO CREATE JOBS?  
>> FOR PARTICULAR SLOTS?

>> YES.  
>> NOT FOR THESE PARTICULAR SLOTS.  
TO INCREASE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SLOTS FOR THE SUMMER JOBS.  
>> BUT IT WOULD BE ADD NERD THROUGH YEE AS WELL, THE HOBNOB FUND SOMETHING.  
>> THE HOBNOB FUNDING IS BCYF.  
>> OKAY.  
>> AND YEE IS A SEPARATE DEPARTMENT, BUT -- TO SUPPORT OTHER INITIATIVES, NOT SPECIFICALLY FOR THE YEE SUMMER JOBS.  
>> GOT IT.  
AND SO -- IN THE ENTIRETY OF WHEN THE CITY HAS THE APPLICATION PROGRAM AND THE SUCCESS LINK PROGRAM THAT IS ALL YEE, THOUGH.  
>> THAT IS ALL YEE.  
>> OKAY.  
ANYTHING ELSE THAT WE SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THIS GRANT?  
>> NO.  
>> OKAY.  
THANK YOU.  
THANK YOU VERY MUCH.  
>> KARL.  
>> THANK YOU COUNCILOR, THE I AM KARL SPECTRE, COMMISSIONER OF THE ENVIRONMENT AND A HERE TO TALK ABOUT TALK ABOUT DON'T 12:30 THIN WHICH INVOLVES A GRANT OF \$33,500 TO THE CITY OF BOSTON.  
THE GRANT IS FOR TWO PURPOSES. IT WILL COVER PHASE 3 OF THE ROXBURY SURVEY BY THE BOSTON LANDMARKS COMMISSION AND WILL COVER THE CENTRAL SECTION OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND WARREN STREET, AND PRODUCE UP TO DATE DOCUMENTATION OF ABOUT 130 HISTORIC PROPERTIES OR HISTORIC RESOURCES IN THE ROXBURY NEIGHBORHOOD.  
THERE HAS NOT BEEN A SERVING IN THIS AREA SINCE THE 1980S.  
THE GRANT WILL ALSO PROVIDE \$5,000 FOR THE LANDMARK COMMISSION TO OVERSEE A COMPLETION OF THE NATIONAL

REGISTER NOMINATION FOR THE  
MALCOLM X -- COLLINS HOUSE ..  
THE CITY, THE HOUSE IS ALL  
READY, ALREADY DESIGNATED A CITY  
OF BOSTON LANDMARK THAT THIS  
WILL ENABLE US TO DO A MORE  
COMPREHENSIVE DOCUMENTATION OF  
THE HISTORY AND SIGNIFICANCE OF  
THIS HOUSE SO THAT IT CAN BE  
ENTERED INTO THE NATIONAL  
REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES.  
AS I MENTIONED, THIS IS -- THE  
GRANT IS FUNDING PHASE 3 OF THE  
ROXBURY SURVEY OF PHASING 1 AND  
2, WERE FUNDED IN THE PAST TWO  
YEARS BY A SIMILAR GRANT, AND  
RESULTED IN THE DOCUMENTATION OF  
273 HISTORIC RESOURCES IN THE  
ROXBURY NEIGHBORHOOD.

>> THANK YOU.

SO WHEN -- AGAIN I HAVE  
QUESTIONS FOR EACH OF THESE  
PIECES.

WHEN YOU SAY SURVEY IT IS NOT  
JUST BOUNDARIES, THEN?

IS IT --

>> CORRECT.

>> IT IS IDENTIFICATION AND  
DOCUMENTATION OF SIGNIFICANT  
HISTORIC RESOURCES IN THE  
NEIGHBORHOOD.

THE SURVEY OF -- THE SURVEY  
RESULTS IN SURVEY FORMS WHICH --  
FOR THE INDIVIDUAL HISTORIC  
RESOURCES, THIS IDENTIFIES THE  
-- THE ADDRESS, THE DATES AND  
SIGNIFICANT ASPECTS OF THE  
HISTORIC RESOURCE, AND THOSE ARE  
SURVEY FORMS WHICH ARE AVAILABLE  
ON THE -- THROUGH THE CITY OF  
BOSTON -- THE BOSTON LANDMARKS  
WEBSITE AND TO THE MASS  
HISTORICAL COMMISSION, THEN  
BECOME THE BASIS FOR FURTHER  
ACTION THAT THE CITY MAY TAKE.  
OBVIOUSLY THEY ASSIST THE  
COMMUNITY IN UNDERSTANDING WHAT  
IS THERE.

THEY CAN BE USED IN DETERMINING  
THE POSSIBLE APPLICATION OF  
ARTICLE 85 FOR DEMOLITION DELAY.  
THEY CAN BE USED WHEN PROPERTY  
OWNERS LOOK FOR HISTORIC TAX  
CREDITS FOR THOSE PROPERTIES.

THEY CAN BE USED TO SUPPORT AN APPLICATION -- AN APPLICATION TO THE COMMUNITY, THE COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE AND GRANTS AVAILABLE.

>> AND HOW -- I GUESS WHAT IS TRIGGERING THE -- AN INDIVIDUAL PROPERTY TO BE INCLUDED?

IS IT THAT THE AREA IS JUST IN GENERAL -- WE KNOW THE BUILDINGS DATE TO A CERTAIN TIME SO WE KNOW THERE IS PROBABLY SOMETHING HISTORIC ABOUT MOST OF THEM SO THE SURVEY TAKERS ARE GOING THROUGH PARCEL BY PARCEL OR IS IT SOMETHING WHERE INDIVIDUALS, PROPERTY OWN VERSUS TO SAY WE DO CONSIDER MY ADDRESS AS WELL?

>> NO, NO, THIS IS DONE ON OUR INITIATIVE.

WE GO THROUGH PARCEL BY PARCEL, AND THERE IS,, YOU KNOW,, A HIERARCHY OF SIGNIFICANCE .. THAT HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND OBVIOUSLY THE WORK THAT WE ARE DOING HERE AND, YOU KNOW, THE PROPERTIES -- THE PROPERTIES ARE EVALUATED ACCORDING TO THE RUBRICS THERE TO IDENTIFY WHAT LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE FROM NATIONAL, REGIONAL OR LOCAL SIGNIFICANCE, AND IT IS PART OF A SURVEY.

AS I SAID, SOME AREAS OF THE CITY AS ROXBURY HAVE NOT BEEN -- THE SURVEYS HAVE NOT BEEN BROUGHT UP TO DATE IN QUITE A WHILE AND THE SURVEYS MAY NOT HAVE BEEN AS COMPLETE AND COMPREHENSIVE IN THE PAST AS WE MAY HAVE LIKED THEM TO BE SO THIS IS PART OF OUR DESIRE TO SYSTEMATICALLY BRING OUR SURVEY OF THE CITY UP TO DATE.

OBVIOUSLY IT IS A SMALL PIECE AT A TIME.

>> YES.

>> BUT WE KEEP GOING.

>> HOW MANY PHASES DO YOU ANTICIPATE WOULD BE NECESSARY TO COMPLETE ROXBURY?

>> THIS -- THIS IS A GRANT THAT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO RECEIVE

ANNUALLY THROUGH THE MASS  
HISTORICAL COMMISSION.  
WE MIGHT DECIDE TO DO A PHASE  
4 OF THIS, IT WILL DEPEND A LOT  
ON HOW MUCH PROGRESS IS MADE  
THIS YEAR.  
DEPENDING ON THAT, AND HOW WE  
JUDGE THE PRIORITY NEEDS OF THE  
CITY AS A WHOLE.  
WE MAY CHOOSE TO LOOK AT ANOTHER  
NEIGHBORHOOD NEXT YEAR THAT HAS  
NOT BEEN DETERMINED YET.  
>> THE NEXT FEW NEIGHBORHOODS IN  
LINE THAT WOULD NEED UPDATING OR  
HAVEN'T HAD A RECENT SURVEY,  
WHAT NEIGHBORHOODS?..  
>> I AM NOT SURE?  
>> AS I SAID, WE HAVE BEEN  
WORKING -- THIS IS OUR THIRD  
YEAR OF WORKING ON ROBS ROCKS

DOCUMENTATION FOR THE  
APPLICATION?  
>> THAT'S RIGHT.  
IT WILL BE GOING INTO THE  
HISTORIC RECORDS TO TRACE MORE
