\$498,291 FOR THE FIRST RESPONDER
COMPREHENSIVE ADDICTION AND
RECOVERY I ARE ACT COOPERATIVE
AGREEMENT, THE GRANT WILL FUND
THE BOSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT
RECOVERY PROGRAM.

AND IN DOCKET 0108, AUTHORIZES
2.25 MILLION IN THE FY 19 BUDGET
FOR THE BOSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT
STATE TRAINING GRANT, THIS WILL
FUND THE BOSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT
TRAINING DIVISION FOR FY 19.

DOCKET 0112 AUTHORIZES \$100,000
FOR THE FY 2019 TRAFFIC
ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM PROGRAM,
HIGH VISIBILITY TRAFFIC
ENFORCEMENT OF TRAFFIC LAWS
INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO
SPEEDING AND AGGRESSIVE DRIVING,

SAFETY INITIATIVE. THIS GRANT WILL FUND REGIONAL AND MULTIDISCIPLINARY APPROACHES TO COMBAT GANG VIOLENCE, DOCKET 0218 AUTHORIZES \$305,000 FOR FY 18 COMPREHENSIVE OPIOID ABUSE BASED PROGRAM.

THIS GRANT WILL FUND A PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE BOSTON PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION TO CONDUCT HOME VISITS TO VISIT OPIOID OVERDOSE SURVIVORS.

DOCKET 0219 AUTHORIZES \$257,000 FOR FY 2018 DNA CAPACITY ENHANCEMENT AND BACKLOG REDUCTION PROGRAM AND DOCKET NUMBER 0503 AUTHORIZES 280,000 FOR THE SAFE AND SUCCESSFUL YOUTH INITIATIVE THAT IS AN AMENDMENT FROM FY 18 AND 19, THIS WILL FUND INTERAGENCY STRATEGY THAT JOINS AGENCIES TO REDUCE YOUTH VIOLENCE IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

SO WE WILL TAKE THEM IN ORDER, IF YOU COULD JUST GIVE ME YOUR NAME AND AFFILIATION AND WE WILL CRANK IT RIGHT OUT. SO WE WILL START WITH DOCKET 0104.

THIS IS THE \$498,000 FOR THE FIRST RESPONDERS COMPREHENSIVE ADDICTION AND RECOVERY ACT COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT.

OKAY.

THANK YOU, COUNCILOR MCCARTHY. MY NAME IS CONNIE WONG, DEPUTY COMMISSIONER FOR LABOR RELATIONS, HUMAN RESOURCES AND LEGAL AFFAIRS FOR THE BOSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT.

AS TO DOCKET 0104, THAT IS THE GRANT GIVEN TO THE BOSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT THROUGH THE SANSA GRANT, WHICH IS FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES AND IT IS ADMINISTERED THROUGH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES AND IT IS TO SUPPORT OUR EFFORTS AT COMBATING THE OPIOID CRISIS AND TO EXPAND THE DEPARTMENT'S KNOCK AND TALK PROGRAM WHERE WE HAVE MEMBERS IN COLLABORATION WITH THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF RECOVERY SERVICES, THE THE

BOSTON HEALTH COMMISSION AND
COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS TO
GO OUT TO ACTUAL RESIDENTS WHOM
WE HAVE ADMINISTERED FOR CAMPHOR
AND OFFER FURTHER .. SUBSTANCE
ABUSE AND OPIOID RECOVERY
SERVICES.

THE STATE.

IT IS FUNDED THROUGH ASSESSMENTS
IMPOSED BY THE INSURANCE

ANYTHING, BUT IT IS VERY, VERY
IMPORTANT FOR THE BOSTON FIRE
DEPARTMENT AND IT PAYS FOR OUR
TRAINING.

WE HAVE DONE BACK TO BASICS
TRAINING TO TRAIN EVERY
FIREFIGHTER IN EVERY COMPANY
THROUGH THE CITY, CONTINUING
TRAINING.

WE HAVE A LOT OF LIVE FIRE TYPE
OF EXERCISES AND TECHNICAL
RESCUE TYPE OF TRAINING THAT WE
HAVE DONE IN THE LAST YEAR AND
WE CONTINUE TO DO FOR THE
FORESEEABLE FUTURE AND THIS IS
ALSO GOING TO HELP SUPPLEMENT
OUR INTENTION TO HOLD A REGIONAL
ACADEMY PROGRAM FOR THE "GREATER
BOSTON" AREA FIRE DEPARTMENT,
SINCE THERE IS A LONG WAITING
LIST FOR FIREFIGHTERS TO ENTER

CRIMINALIST SO PRIMARILY FOR

FOR REQUIRED TRAINING FOR THE
DNA STAFF SO WE USE A PORTION OF
IT FOR THAT AND THEN WE USE
ANOTHER PORTION OF IT FOR
CONSUMABLES AND SUPPLIES FOR DNA
TESTING AND THIS IS ALL TO
SUPPLEMENT OUR OPERATING BUDGET.

>> GOOD MORNING AGAIN, CHAIRMAN MCCARTHY.

FRANK DELUCA FROM BOSTON OFFICE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT. I AM THE PROGRAM COORDINATOR FOR THE SAFE AND SUCCESSFUL YOUTH INITIATIVE, OR SSI.

THE PURPOSE OF THE GRANT IS TO COMBAT YOUTH VIOLENCE IN THE CITY.

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES HAS SUPPLEMENTED OUR AWARD WITH ANOTHER \$280,000. THIS WILL ENABLE THE CITY TO ALSO ADDRESS YOUNG FEMALES THAT ARE INVOLVED WITH VIOLENT CRIME IN ADDITION TO THE MALES, THAT THEY ARE LIMITED TO RIGHT NOW. THE SUPPLEMENT IS AGAIN \$280,000 OF WHICH 30,000 IS IMMEDIATELY PURPOSED FOR PLANNING FOR A PILOT PROGRAM FOR WOMEN, STARTING FISCAL YEAR '20.

>> THANK YOU.

WHERE WAS THE PROGRAM FOR THE \$30,000 FOR PLANNING -- WHERE WOULD THAT BE? WOULD THAT BE BASED OUT OF THE HOSPITAL OR CLINICS OR HOW WOULD THAT WORK?

>> NO, ACTUALLY, THE 30,000 WHICH IS JUST PLANNING WILL BE IN ORDER TO CONSULTANTS TO HELP FORMULATE THE PLAN FOR THE PILOT.

>> FOR THE ROLLOUT OF THE -- OKAY.

>> OKAY.

SO I THINK WE WILL JUST PUT IN A TEMPORARY RECESS UNTIL WE HAVE PROPER PEOPLE TO SPEAK ON 0216, 0218.

I AM BILLS, THE PROGRAM
COORDINATOR FOR THE SHANNON
GRANT FOR BOSTON POLICE
DEPARTMENT.

I AM THE SHANNON GRANT IS A NOW
13 YEAR ANTI-VIOLENCE AND YOUTH
VIOLENCE PREVENTION GRANT
AWARDED FROM THE EXECUTIVE
OFFICE OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND
SECURITY.

ADMINISTERED BY THE BOSTON
POLICE DEPARTMENT.

WE IN OUR GRANT FOR THIS YEAR WE
ARE FLYING 24 DIFFERENT
NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS IN THEIR
EFFORTS AND PREVENTION TO YOUTH
VIOLENCE AND GANG VIOLENCE. THE
BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT WILL
ALSO HAVE THREE DIFFERENT POOLS
OF FUNDS FOR THE YOUTH VIOLENCE
STRIKE FORCE, THE DRUG CONTROL
UNIT, AND THE COMMUNITY POLICING
UNIT.

THIS IS, OUR EFFORTS IN THE
SHANNON GRANT, \$1 MILLION OF
THIS WILL GO DIRECTLY TO
NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, THEY
ALL APPLIED THROUGH COMPETITIVE
RFP, LAST AUGUST, IT WAS A
MONTHLONG PROCESS.

THEY APPLIED UP TO \$40,000 FOR
NONPROFITS AND UP TO \$100,000
FOR A CITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS
AND EFFORTS AND WE ALSO FUND
YOUTH CONNECT, WHICH IS ONE OF
OUR MAIN VIOLENCE PREVENTION
EFFORTS WITHIN THE BOSTON POLICE
DEPARTMENT, SOCIAL WORKERS IN
DIFFERENT DISTRICTS.

THIS IS THE LARGEST POOL WE HAVE
HAD IN AT LEAST FIVE YEARS, FOR
THE SHANNON, POSSIBLY DUE TO
OTHER EFFORTS IN YOUTH VIOLENCE
PREVENTION WITH THE YOUTH

DEVELOPMENT FUND THAT WE ALSO ADMINISTER THROUGH THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT.

>> THAT'S IT.

>> ALL RIGHT.

IS IT -- THIS IS UNDER -- THIS WILL BE UNDER DEPUTY BASSIN?

>> THROUGH THE COMMUNITY POLICING EFFORTS, YES, THAT PART IS UNDER DEPUTY BASS SIN.

>> BUT THE WHOLE GRANT IS ADMINISTERED THE FROM OUR OFFICE, THE OFFICE OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT.

>> OKAY.

>> AND CAN YOU JUST GIVE ME JUST A COUPLE .. -- THE NONPROFITS THAT APPLY, ARE WE TALKING ABOUT BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS AND THAT SORT OF STUFF?

>> YES.

WE ARE TALKING -- SO I WILL TRY TO GO THROUGH THE WHOLE -->> JUST GIVE ME, YOU KNOW -->> PROJECT RIGHT, FOR JUSTICE AND EQUALITY, BROWN YOUTH, YOUTH CONNECT AS I MENTIONED, YOUTH OF.

OF BOSTON.

>> THE CEOS WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH FOR A LONG TIME.

>> YES.

>> THAT IS GREAT.

>> OUT OF THOSE 24 APPLICANTS THAT WE HAVE, WE RECEIVED ABOUT 65 APPLICATIONS IN TOTAL.

>> SURE.

AND WE WENT THROUGH IT KIND OF COMPREHENSIVELY TO LOOK AT WHAT ARE THE EFFORTS, WHAT AREAS ARE THEY IN, HOW MANY YOUNG PEOPLE WILL THEY SERVE?

WHAT IS THEIR, THE STRENGTH OF THE ORGANIZATION?

SO ALL OF THOSE KIND OF FACTOR INTO WHO GETS THE GRANT.

>> RIGHT.

>> I HAVE A BOARD THAT I GO THROUGH TO KIND OF LOOK THROUGH THESE THINGS AND SO IT IS NOT JUST THE POLICE.

IT IS ALSO COMMUNITY EFFORT FOR THE SCORING OF THE GRANT.

>> OKAY.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

>> LET'S MOVE ON TO DOCKET
0218 WHICH IS A \$305,000 GRANT
FOR FY 18 FOR THE COMPREHENSIVE
OPIATE ABUSE SITE BASED PROGRAM.

>> HI, I AM SORRY.

MY NAME IS MARIACHI VASS, THE
DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH AND
DEVELOPMENT FOR THE BOSTON
POLICE DEPARTMENT.

FOR RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT IS
WORKING IN THE BOSTON POLICE
DEPARTMENT IS WORKING WITH THE
MAYOR'S OFFICE OF RECOVERY
SERVICES IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE
FY 18 COMPREHENSIVE OPIATE ABUSE
SITE PROGRAM.

THE MONEY, THE FUNDING IS COMING
OUT OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF
JUSTICE IN THE BOSTON POLICE
DEPARTMENT IS ADMINISTERING THE
GRANT, ALTHOUGH THE LEAD PARTNER
AGAIN IS THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF
RECOVERY SERVICES.

THE FUNDING WE RECEIVED WAS
\$305,362.

AND THERE ARE FOUR COMPONENTS TO
THIS MODEL.

THE FIRST COMPONENT WILL BE A
SYSTEMATIC ANALYSIS OF 911 CALL
DATA WHEN IT COMES TO FATAL AND
NONFATAL OPIATE OVERDOSES, AND
FOR CAM ADMINISTRATION AND OTHER
FACTORS .. WITH THAT SAID, THERE
WILL BE THE HIRING OF ONE FULL
TIME PROJECT COORDINATOR AS WELL
AS A PROFESSIONAL EVALUATOR THAT
WILL EVALUATE THE COMPONENTS OF
THE MODEL, AS WELL AS LOOK AT --
DO PART ONE WHICH IS SYMPTOMATIC
ANALYSIS.

THE SECOND COMPONENT INCLUDES
HOME BASED MULTIJURISDICTIONAL
VISITS BETWEEN BOSTON POLICE
OFFICERS AND ADVOCATES FROM THE
BOSTON PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION
AFTER A NONFATAL OPIATE
OVERDOSE. SO THEY WILL REPORT
SPECIFICALLY ON AN ONGOING BASIS
AND VISIT THE HOMES OF PEOPLE
WHO HAVE SUFFERED FROM AN
OVERDOSE, NONFATAL.

WHEN THEY GO TO THAT HOME, THEY
WILL EACH QUARTER TRY TO GET AT

LEAST 100 PERSONS WHO HAVE
OVERDOSED INTO TREATMENT DETOX
OR HOME BASED SERVICES.
AND SO TO PREVENT FUTURE
OVERDOSES.

THEY WILL BRING TO THE HOME
INFORMATION, TREATMENT
KNOWLEDGE, REFERRALS AND A WIDE
RANGE OF INFORMATION THAT WILL
HELP FAMILIES AND VICTIMS OF
OVERDOSE GET ACCESS TO THE
SERVICES AND RESOURCES THEY
NEED.

OTHER -- ALONG WITH THAT, THE
EVALUATOR WILL EVALUATE THE
PILOT AND MANY ASPECTS INVOLVED
IN THE PILOT TO SEE IF THERE IS
EFFICACY AND CONTINUATION AND
STABILITY OF THIS HOME BASED
MODEL.

ONE OF THE OTHER FACTORS BEYOND
JUST 100 REFERRALS, A QUARTER,
THEY WILL -- BASED ON THE
EVALUATION OUT COMES THEY WILL
DEVELOP SUSTAINABLE PLAN TO
CONTINUE OR EXPAND THE MOST
EFFECTIVE ELEMENTS OF THE
INTERVENTION.

TO ACCOMPLISH THESE GOALS, THE
BPD WILL HIRE A FULL-TIME
PROJECT COORDINATOR AND WORK
CLOSELY WITH OUR RESEARCH
PARTNER, DR. J RICHARD ROY OF
RJW ASSOCIATES WHO HAS A
RELATIONSHIP WITH THE BOSTON
PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION AND HAS
A LONGSTANDING HISTORY WITH
EFFECTIVE EVALUATION PROGRAMMING
FOR OUR PARKS AND PUBLIC HEALTH
COMMISSION.

>> OKAY.

THANK YOU.

THE ONLY QUESTION I HAVE, IS
ONLY THE DATA REGARDING WHAT
YOU, REGARDING 911, DO WE
COLLECT WHERE THE PEOPLE ARE
FROM ORIGINAL.

>> I KNOW THE HOME BASED VISITS
ARE BOSTON BASED VISITS AND NOT
GOING TO QUINCY, FOR INSTANCE,
BUT THE DATA FOR 911 CALLS FOR
WHETHER IT IS HOMELESS OR
WHATEVER, FOR SOMEBODY WHO IS
OUTSIDE OF THE CITY, DO WE

COLLECT THAT?

>> YES.

>> THE ONLY REASON I ASK THAT IS BECAUSE MAYOR WALSH IS LEADING THE CHARGE ON THE LONG ISLAND BRIDGE AND INFORMATION LIKE THAT IS REALLY IMPERATIVE BECAUSE WE AS A CITY CONTINUE TO TAKE ON AS YOU KNOW AS BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT, WE TAKE ON EVERYTHING IN MASSACHUSETTS, AND EVEN BEYOND MASSACHUSETTS, BOSTON ALWAYS WEARS EVERYTHING. AND WE REALLY NEED A REGIONAL APPROACH, WHETHER IT IS TO TRAUMA, WHETHER TO OPIATE CRISIS, WHETHER IT IS TO LOW INCOME HOUSING, IT NEEDS TO BE A REGIONAL APPROACH SO THE MORE DATA WE HAVE OF PEOPLE WHO DON'T LIVE IN THE CITY YET COME HERE, THEY ARE EITHER COMING HERE FOR SERVICES AND THE SERVICES FAIL THEM OR, YOU KNOW, THEY ARE STRUGGLING THEMSELVES. IT IS IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO HAVE.

AND A LOT OF THEM ARE COMING HERE TO PURCHASE AND THEN OVERDOSE HERE.

SO YES THERE IS DATA THAT, WE LOOK AT THAT AS WELL AS HOW MANY NORCAM ADMINISTRATION ARE TAKEN PLACE AND HOW MANY LIVES ARE SAVED BY THAT, BY THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT AND EMS AND FIRE OF IT IS ONE OF THE RULES OF THE FULL TIME PROJECT COORDINATOR IS ALSO TO ORGANIZE THOSE THREE CITY AGENCIES AND THE PROGRAMMING THAT IS COMING FORTH OUT OF THOSE THREE AGENCIES RELATED TO SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER AND COMPONENTS THAT ALL THREE ARE TRYING TO IMPLEMENT IN THAT AREA.
