TO THE CITY COUNCIL

Dear Councilors:

I retransmit herewith my Fiscal Year 2020 Recommended Budget for the City of Boston. Thank you for the robust and thoughtful dialogue on the FY20 Operating Budget and FY20-FY24 Capital Plan at the over 30 City Council hearings. The resubmitted \$3.49 billion FY20 Operating Budget and \$2.78 billion FY20-FY24 Capital Plan are balanced, sustainable and allow us to turn policy into action and planning into results. The budget represents our shared path to move Boston forward and ensure every resident has an equitable opportunity to partake in Boston's bright future.

The underpinnings of the City's finances continue to be strong, thanks to sound fiscal management, robust economic growth and wise investments that have accelerated our ambitious goals for the City. The FY20 Operating Budget represents a spending increase of \$174 million or 5.3% over FY19 and makes bold and strategic investments aimed at improving the lives and quality of life for residents next year, and for years to come.

Included in the resubmitted budget is feedback from the City Council hearings and testimony from stakeholders and the public. The adjustments to the FY20 Operating Budget and the Boston Public Schools (BPS) budget reflect commitments to collective bargaining, preservation of critical city services, and targeted investments to improve service delivery. Changes include:

- A \$38.6 million transfer from the City collective bargaining reserve to the FY20 Boston Public Schools budget to reflect the FY20 costs of the Boston Teachers Union contract.
- A \$5 million increase in the remaining FY20 collective bargaining reserve to reflect outstanding contracts.
- Following a rigorous procurement of waste removal and recycling services, an additional \$4.8 million is required to pay for these critical City services.
- \$150,000 has been added to the Boston Police Department FY20 budget to support additional positions in the Forensics Unit.
- \$100,000 has been added to provide menstrual product access to Boston Public Schools students.
- \$92,000 in additional funding has been added to the Boston Public Library to maintain critical facility services at the branches.
- In order to better analyze vehicle accident data in the City, \$60,000 has been added to the Boston Police Department FY20 budget for a transportation analyst position.
- And finally \$55,000 to build capacity and improve outreach and engagement efforts for the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Advancement.



These additional investments are made possible thanks to additional revenue identified since the initial FY20 Recommended Budget was submitted in April. They include updated projections on departmental revenue and continued positive market conditions that have increased our expected interest on investment revenue.

The FY20 recommended budget reflects our shared priorities and the plans we have worked together to construct; it turns those ideas into real services to benefit residents. We are investing in every neighborhood in many ways: the streets we drive and bike down; the sidewalks we walk on; the housing we create; the schools, libraries, community centers and municipal buildings that residents utilize every day; preparing our City for climate change, and the people, services and programs that touch residents' lives.

I respectfully request your favorable action on the FY20 Operating Budget and the FY20-FY24 Capital Plan.

Appropriation and Tax Order for the fiscal year Commencing July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020

ORDERED:

I. That to meet the current expenses of the City of Boston, in the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, the respective sums of money specified in the schedules hereinafter set out, be, and the same hereby are, appropriated for expenditure under the direction of the respective boards and officers severally specified, for the several specific purposes hereinafter designated and, except for transfers lawfully made, for such purposes only said appropriations, to the extent they are for the maintenance and operation of parking meters, and the regulation of parking and other activities incident thereto (which is hereby determined to be \$23,900,000), being made out of the income from parking meters and, to the extent they are for other purposes, being made out of the proceeds from the sale of tax title possessions and receipts from tax title redemptions in addition to the total real and personal property taxes of prior years collected from July 1, 2017 up to and including March 31, 2018, as certified by the City Auditor under Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws, and out of available funds on hand, (which is hereby determined to be \$40,000,000) as certified by the Director of Accounts under said Section 23, and the balance of said appropriations to be raised by taxation pursuant to Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws:
