AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM FUNDS, AWARDED BY MASSACHUSETTS EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF ENERGY & ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS/DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION & RECREATION, NOT TO EXCEED FIFTY-EIGHT THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$58,916).

ORDERED: That the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston, be, and hereby is, authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the Recreational Trails Program grant award from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy & Environmental Affairs/Department of Conservation & Recreation, in an amount not to exceed FIFTY-EIGHT THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$58,916) for the purpose of funding expenses, fees and services for an accessible gateway and path into the Arnold Arboretum from the Bussey Street underpass in Roslindale.

I transmit herewith for your approval an Order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend the amount of FIFTY-EIGHT THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$58,916.00) in the form of a grant, Recreational Trails Program, awarded by the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy & Environmental Affairs/Department of Conservation & Recreation, to be administered by the Boston Transportation Department.

The grant would fund additional expenses, fees and professional services beyond what was originally anticipated for a new, accessible gateway and path into the Arboretum from the Bussey Street Underpass in Roslindale.
