**AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND FEDERAL FY 2019 CONTINUUM OF CARE PROGRAM FUNDS FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT.**

**WHEREAS:** the City of Boston is eligible to apply for Federal FY 2019 Continuum of Care Program grant funds; and

**WHEREAS:** the Department of Neighborhood Development will administer the Federal FY 2019 Continuum of Care Program grant funds; now, therefore, be it

**ORDERED:** that the City of Boston, acting by and through its Department of Neighborhood Development, be, and hereby is, authorized to apply for FY 2019 Continuum of Care Program funds in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Three Million Dollars (\$33,000,000.00) from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, and to accept and expend said funds in accordance with M.G.L. c. 44, § 53A for the purposes for which the funds are granted as stated in the City of Boston's Federal FY 2019 Continuum of Care Program application, and in connection therewith, is authorized to execute and deliver such documents as may be required by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.
