Presentation updated following the working session with the addition of demographic data and to reflect discussion among Councilors reconciling split precincts to baseline districts as a starting point for the ongoing redistricting process

#### **ADOPTION OF ADJUSTED PRECINCTS**



The Boston Board of Election Commissioners adjusted select voting precincts in 2021 in conjunction with State congressional and legislative redistricting. The Board further completed the reprecincting process in April 2022, increasing the total number of precincts in the City from 255 to 275.

#### Guidelines used by the Board of Election Commissioners

- Wards with precincts containing more than 3,000 registered voters were considered for review.
- Census block groups within each Ward were used to create precincts.
- Aimed to keep precincts at 2,000 voters within a margin of +/- 10%
  - Adjustments were made to certain precincts in order to eliminate sub-precincts caused by state legislative redistricting.
- Precinct boundaries determined using linear features such as roadways, railroads, waterways, and/or other easily identifiable features.
- Use of projected residential growth taken into consideration.

## **NEW PRECINCTS SPLIT BETWEEN CURRENT DISTRICTS**



There are 16 "split precincts" which now cross into 2 or 3 current Council districts.

They must be moved as a whole during 2022 City Council redistricting.


The precincts are in Wards 3, 4, 8, and 9, and are in current Districts 1, 2, 3, 7, and 8.

They have a total population of 50,226.

Each solid color shape represents a single precinct as of 2022.

The <u>black lines</u> represent current City Council district boundaries, drawn in 2012, in effect for municipal elections from 2013-2021, to be replaced by redistricting.

2022 City Council redistricting must assign each of the 275 voting precincts to a district as a whole. The borders of current districts will be replaced with new borders according to the boundaries of precincts at the edge of a district. These new districts will be effective for municipal elections from 2023-2031.




<sup>\*</sup>Information on proportional share of population per district within a split precinct is not yet available; only rough census block tallies. A census block is the smallest geographic unit used by the U.S. Census Bureau for tabulation of statistical data; they are not delineated based on population or land area.



The objective of the working session is for City
Councilors to review the adjusted precincts
which became "split" precincts when
overlaying current district lines.

Councilors will then tentatively "assign" each of the 16 split precincts into an adjacent district based on general consensus, such that all 275 precincts of the City are wholly within a single City Council district.

The reconciled districts will then become a "baseline" starting point for further consideration of potential precinct shifts through the redistricting process.



### **COMMUNITIES OF INTEREST (COIs)**



A community of interest (COI) is a group of people with shared concerns, interests, and characteristics, who would benefit from being maintained in a single district. Every COI is unique; they might be formed around neighborhoods or the physical landscape, cultures, values, and many other things. Because of these shared interests and concerns, a common redistricting criteria is that COIs be considered.
