COMMUNITY AND THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Your community has an influence on your child's development and is supported by the positive relationships with friends and neighbors, access to playgrounds, parks, stores, local childcare, schools, health centers, and libraries.



LEARNING THROUGH PLAYING

Play builds relationships. Spending time playing with your child sends a simple message: you are very important to me.



RELATIONSHIPS

Through relationships, your child learns they're loved, by whom, and what happens when they experience different emotions. The most important relationship your child has is the one with you.



To begin school, 'ready to learn' children and their caregivers require equal access to the tools and resources they need to thrive.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Parenting methods assist the child with learning, embracing setbacks, and overcoming them. Proper nutrition, exercise, and sleep also make a big difference.
